#### NATIONAL OVERVIEW

These statistics cover the attainment of year 6 pupils who took assessments in summer 2023. These pupils experienced disruption to their learning during the pandemic, particularly at the end of year 3 and in year 4.

# In individual subjects, attainment increased in maths, writing and science compared to 2022. Attainment remained the same in GPS and fell in reading.

In **reading**, 73% of pupils met the expected standard, down from 75% in 2022.

In maths, 73% of pupils met the expected standard, up from 71% in 2022.

In writing, 71% of pupils met the expected standard, up from 69% in 2022.

In grammar, punctuation and spelling, 72% of pupils met the expected standard, unchanged from 2022.

In **science**, 80% of pupils met the expected standard, up from 79% in 2022.

Attainment in all of reading, writing and maths (combined) remained the same as in 2022.

In all of **reading, writing and maths**, 59% of pupils met the expected standard, unchanged from 2022.

In 2023, 59% of pupils reached the expected standard in all of reading, writing and maths, unchanged from 2022. This is below 2019 attainment, where 65% of pupils met the standard. Attainment in all of reading, writing and maths is not directly comparable to some earlier years (2016 and 2017) because of changes to writing teacher assessment frameworks in 2018.

Last year, the Department announced a <u>Levelling Up mission</u> for **90%** of pupils to meet the expected standard in reading, writing and maths **at the end of key stage 2 by 2030.** 

# SCHOOL OVERVIEW

In individual subjects, attainment increased in reading, writing GPS and maths compared to 2022.

In reading, 70.9% of pupils met the expected standard, up from 69.1% in 2022.

In maths, 67.3% of pupils met the expected standard, up from 49.1% in 2022.

In writing, 81.8% of pupils met the expected standard, up from 63.8% in 2022.

In grammar, punctuation and spelling, 63.6% of pupils met the expected standard, up from 61.8% in 2022. Attainment in all of reading, writing and maths (combined) has risen from 2022.

In all of **reading, writing and maths**, 52.7% of pupils met the expected standard, **up** from 34.5% in 2022.

These statistics cover the attainment of year 2 pupils who took assessments in summer 2022. These pupils experienced disruption to their learning during the pandemic, particularly at the end of year R & in year 1. Attainment in all of reading, writing and maths has decreased compared to 2019 – This replicates the national picture.

# In individual subjects, attainment fell in all subjects compared to 2019 – This replicates the local authority and national picture.

70.2% of pupils met the expected standard in reading, **up** from 71.1% in 2019.

70.2% of pupils met the expected standard in maths, down from 73.0% in 2019.

48.9% of pupils met the expected standard in writing, down from 60.0% in 2019.

78.8% of pupils met the expected standard in science, down from 82.2% in 2019.
