






Attendance every day counts.

This year we would like to continue to support the needy and elderly within our parish by contributing a Harvest collection.


We would be extremely grateful if your child could bring a food item to school **from Monday 7th October**. If possible, tinned or dry food with at least 4-6 months left on their use-by date.

The following items would be very much appreciated:

- · Pasta shapes, spaghetti, rice, flour.
- Tinned fruit and vegetables.
- Tinned meat and fish such as ham, tuna or sardines.
- Meat and fish pastes, sandwich spreads, jam.
- Biscuits (sweet and savoury), simple cakes.
- Cooking sauces, mayonnaise, ketchup and any other condiments.
- · Sugar, coffee, tea, milk powder, cooking oil.
- Instant potato, tinned or packet soups.
- Soap, disinfectant, washing powder, toothpaste.

These would be ideal; however, we will gratefully accept any other food and will distribute it to other local causes including the local day centres for the elderly.

Year 6 parents - PESE Secondary School Applications

For children starting year 7 in September 2025 applications will close on **Thursday 31 October 2024.** Parents can apply for up to 4 schools. Put the schools in the order of preference. It's in your best interest to list 4 schools. Naming only one school does not guarantee your child a place at that school or give priority for a place over another child. You are not able to name the same school more than once.

Parents of children who sat the Kent Test will have their results emailed to them on **Thursday 17 October 2024**. KCC will only send the results to the email address used to register your child for the Kent Test.

If you provided an email address on your Secondary School application, KCC will email you on Monday 3 March 2025 after 4pm to tell you which school your child has been offered. Please note:

Development Day reminder

I would like to draw parents attention to the fact the school will be closed on **Friday 29**th **November 2024** for a Staff Development Day – this means children will not be at school on this day.

Who is eligible for free school meals?

Free school meals are available to pupils whose parents are in receipt of, one or more of the following benefits:

- Universal Credit (provided you have an annual net earned income of no more than £7,400, as assessed by earnings from up to three of your most recent assessment periods)
- Income Support
- Income-based Jobseeker's Allowance
- Income-related Employment and Support Allowance
- Support under Part VI of the Immigration and Asylum Act 1999
- The guarantee element of Pension Credit
- Child Tax Credit (provided you're not also entitled to Working Tax Credit and have an annual gross income of no more than £16,190)
- Working Tax Credit run-on paid for four weeks after you stop qualifying for Working Tax Credit

Make sure you apply for your child if your circumstances change – if you have any questions, please contact the school office.

If your child is already receiving free school meals you DO NOT need to re-apply.



Parent /Staff communications.



Research consistently shows that children achieve more when schools and parents / carers work together. The development of positive relationships between families and school takes effort from both parties and typically develops over time rather than over a single event.

Below are a series of recommendations to support parent/ carer expectations when contacting the school.

- Please remember that most teachers, including Subject Leaders and Senior staff, will be teaching when you try to contact them. While it would be ideal for them to respond to your query immediately, this is not possible in all cases. Staff will endeavour to acknowledge receipt of your email or phone call within 48 hours (workdays). If it is something that will require a longer period to investigate, they will acknowledge the concern and a more detailed response will be sent within a specified timescale.
- If the matter is urgent, staff will endeavour to deal with the matter urgently or will explain why that will not be possible.
- Please be aware staff are not expected to monitor or respond to emails outside of their normal working hours (including weekends and holidays).

PE KIT



PE is a compulsory part of the curriculum and children are entitled to 2 hours of PE each week from Year 1 upwards.

We have noticed that throughout school there are some children who are regularly forgetting their PE kits and this is having a detrimental effect on their learning as it may be that children cannot participate without the correct clothing.

It is compulsory that children are required to have their PE kit in school.

We really appreciate those who do bring their PE kits to school religiously and want to make sure that this does not go unnoticed, therefore children who bring their PE kits every week will be rewarded with Dojo Points and will be invited to a sporting morning with Mr Dewey at the end of the school term.

Jewellery at school

Just a reminder that children should not wear jewellery for school except small stud earrings and a watch. If your child wears earrings they must either be able to remove them for PE or not wear them for school. As stated in the national guidance teachers are **not** to tape up earrings for PE. This must be able to be done by the child. Please bear this in mind when getting your child's ears pierced. Children are not allowed to wear nail varnish in school.

FLU IMMUNISATION FOR CHILDREN IN YEAR R to YEAR 6

These immunisations will take place on **Friday 25**th **October 2024** – please make sure you complete the paperwork for your child.

Target Number

A game to play using car number plates on car journeys or simply when you are out and about.

Each player's goal is to get their total to 100 — or as close to it as they can.

(There's nothing special about 100 — if you want to pick a higher or lower target, feel free!)

How to play:

- 1. Each player starts from zero.
- 2. When a vehicle passes, take turns to add up the digits on its number plate e.g. '194', you would add 1+9+4=14
- 3. Add this amount to the running total e.g. if you already have 47, add 14 to your score and say "61".
- 4. You can then choose to 'stick' and make that your final score, or twist and add the next number plate to your total. If you go over 100, you score nothing.
- 5. Whoever 'sticks' closest to 100, wins the round.
